**Education:** graduated in Economics in 1988 from Bocconi University in Milan (Italy). In 1991 she obtained the Certificate of Advanced Studies in International Economic Policy Research at the Institute of World Economics in Kiel (Germany). In 1994 she obtained the Ph.D. in Economics from Bocconi University, with a final dissertation on the growth effects of international trade.

**Research activities:** her research focuses on international trade and economic integration between countries and its effects, and on these matters she has published numerous articles on national and international journals. Recent research projects include: *Network analysis of International trade: empirical and theoretical models*; *The role of international fragmentation of production in global imbalances during the international financial crisis*, *EU trade policies and the expected trade effects of the TTIP*.

**Teaching activities:** she teaches courses in Economics, International Economics and International Markets and European Institutions in the Bachelor and M.Sc. in Managerial Engineering, and within the Business school and doctoral courses of the Politecnico di Milano. She also teaches classes at the graduate and undergraduate level at Bocconi University and Sant'Anna School of Superior Studies, Pisa.
